The exhibition will include paintings by Indonesian artists who won the coveted regional UOB Southeast Asian Painting of the Year award, such as "The Hymn of School" by Y. Indra Wahyu, "Old Stock Fresh Menu" by Antonius Subiyanto and "Exploitation of Fish" by Anggar Prasetyo².

Yogyakarta has a vibrant artist community and attracts many artists from all over Indonesia, while Bandung serves as an avenue for modern art with many budding Indonesian artists enriching the art scene and gaining recognition.

Painting of the Year award in 2012, who is famous for his watercolour and sketch techniques;

Mr Antonius Subiyanto, the second Indonesian artist to win the regional award in 2014, best

known for using charcoal and gold acrylic in his artwork; and Mr Anggar Prasetyo, last year's

UOB Southeast Asian Painting of the Year winner, who used a combination of different

techniques such as moulding, spraying and acrylic painting, for his painting titled Exploitation

of Fish.

About Sensibility

This year, UOB is highlighting the importance of sensibility in art in the 2016 UOB Painting of

the Year competition. Sensibility in art relates to emotions and feelings. It also relates to how

we draw meaning from looking an artwork.

The concept of sensibility is not new but against the current sentiments for instantaneous
